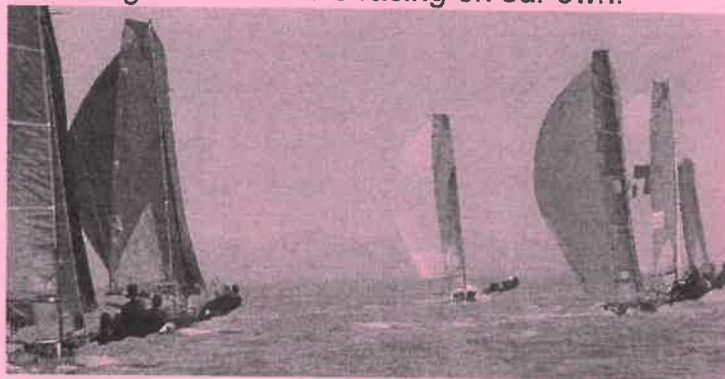


# Killer Green! <sup>PINK</sup>

**Holman** was in the mix until a bad leeward rounding. Dropped him back to 7<sup>th</sup> in the race. Another 2<sup>nd</sup> would have been nicer.



In 2<sup>nd</sup> however the flying Germans -Georg Borkenstein and Eike Dietrich- had a nice recovery from their previous day. They are also tied for second overall. Eike attributed the high finish to Georg not over steering ( or as they say in Hamburg: Rum Rühren or better still Wriggen). They were late getting back to the dock said Eike because “Georg had to swing by his girlfriend to say ‘Hi.’”
